



Women Advocacy Group (WAG) is an advocacy group which continuously monitors the status of women in different areas, with particular focus on politics and involvement in the process of EU integration. WAG regularly creates commentaries on the EC Country Report.

WAG has been active since 2016, and it comprices civil society organizations from across Bosnia and Herzegovina, student organizations and individuals who fight for gender equality.

Through its work, WAG promotes the significance of including CSOs in the process of EU integration, and particularly the importance of integrating the principles of women's human rights in national legislation through the EU accession process. WAG members regularly advocate for the established recommendations and priorities before the EU institutions in Brussels.

As part of the "Women's Voices and Perspectives Integrated into EU Accession Process" supported by the Kvinna till Kvinna Foundation, several documents have been published so far: <u>Women's Perspectives: Alternative Responses to the European Commission's</u> <u>Questionnaire</u>, Where are Women in the Coordinating Mechanism for EU Integration?, <u>How to</u> <u>Ensure Gender Equality through the Process of EU Integration</u>, and Reform Agenda II: an Overview through the Prism of Women's Rights.
